

"Bimbo"

I don't believe one of our members would for a minute be quiet if someone referred to our beautiful birds in this way. Pete Bedall (AOPA magazine writer) described our Dukes that way in the August issue.

Bob Stan and Jim Gorman expressed their anger regarding the article, as well as, your president and hopefully a lot of you.

Mr. Bedell in his e-mail to me said "I apologize if the term "bimbo" offended you as the owner of a Duke. Perhaps that term may have been a little blunt." He went on to point out that with a weight ratio of 8.9 pounds per horsepower we are more powerful than any of our competitors.

Jim Gorman sent him a comparison done by Business and Commercial Aviation, May, 1994. It shows the Duke has a higher useful load with full fuel than a Cessna 340, 414, 421 or a Piper Mojave. It cruises faster than all but the Cessna 421, which they claim does 218 knots compared to the Duke at 212 knots, at gross weight and 65% power. Jim says he has never met a 421 pilot who claims more than 210 knots.

Deluge AOPA with complaints. I asked if we couldn't tell our story from the owner's viewpoint and point out how we very effectively resolved most issues relative to our Dukes. Pete Bedell says, "I have never owned a Duke but would certainly like to."

The Shreveport Fly-In was cancelled to allow Glen and Ellen Adams to concentrate their time and talent on the large business expansion that they have committed to. We visited with them in Shreveport and realized that it was not fair for them to have to take time to do the Fly-In.

Fortunately, as you can see from the enclosed Fly-In information, Lloyd Copenbarger and Mark Seader came forward and volunteered to host it in Chino, CA. FAA To Send Ads, SAIBs by Email Only

All Airworthiness Directives (Ads) and Special Airworthiness Information Bulletins (SAIBs) will be sent *only* by email beginning as early as next month. You must register an email address with the FAA to get these vital safety advisories.

In a recent email exchange with the FAA that a member forwarded to ABS, September 2007 is named the "target date" for discontinuing mailing of ADs and SAIBs to airplane owners and persons who service aircraft.

To register for ADs and SAIBs go to http:rgl.faa.gov. This is the FAA's Regulatory and Guidance Library website. Follow the links to subscribe, or go directly to

http://service.govdelivery.com/service/multi_subscribe.html?code=USFAARGL. You'll need to sign up for the specific model airplane, engine and propeller ADs/SAIBs separately. Because of the large number of aircraft and component types, signing up is somewhat cumbersome, especially if you own or service multiple airplane types.

In the email exchange forwarded to ABS and FAA official confirmed ADs for appliances normally installed on selected airframes or engines will be sent to those who register for the airframe or engine (example: magneto ADs will be sent to those who register engines on which those magnetos are commonly installed). There is apparently no provision for receiving ADs for aftermarket airframe or engine modifications or component substitutions — we'll update ABS NEWS if we get clarification but for now contact the STC holder or accessory source to determine their means to disseminate ADs and SAIBs affecting their products after September 2007.
