HOW TO SAVE YOUR GENERATORS

1) Leave generators off the line until both engines are started. This prevents an overload on operating generator when starting second engine.

Ben Morrow of FAA sends the following:


- 1) Inspection found oil line was extremely leaky. Part installed May, 1993. (Be sure date code has not expired.) P444
- 2) While trying to locate the source of a fuel leak, a .3750 inch by 12" threaded rod with a nut, washer and 3" diameter paint can lid were found lodged under the flapper valve of leading edge tank. Tanks were replaced 4 years earlier (No comment) P-230




With this Newsletter are two (2) forms we would appreciate you returning as soon as possible:

His experience shows the generator will have a catastrophic failure as you approach 900 - 1000 hours. Terry says the difference in repair cost is mind boggling - about \$4000.
